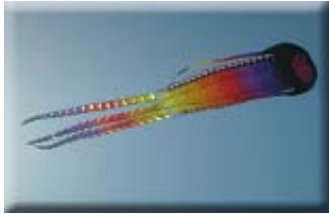


The QKS also owns its own kites; like our colourful Trilobyte & FloForm.

QKS has flown kites at various locations throughout Queensland for many years.

Currently in the greater Brisbane area Fly-ins are held on the second and fourth Sundays at Pelican Park, on the Hornibrook Esplanade, Clontarf (Northside), just north of Brisbane and on the 4th Sunday at Murarrie Recreation Ground (Southside) or 5th Sunday at Stumers Creek, Coolum Beach.



Kite festivals are regularly held around Queensland during the year, with many QKS members attending.

At Fly-ins and Festivals, the sky is literally full of colour and movement, including Traditional single line and box kites, dual-line stunt kites, team flying and quad-line trick kites.

Kite festivals attract huge crowds and are free for the public. They are a great event for families and both old and young.



In past years, QKS has participated in kite festivals at Redcliffe, Coolum Beach, Moore Park (Bundaberg) and Emu Park (Yeppoon).

Coolum Beach has become a major annual festival on the Eastern Seaboard of Australia attracting as many as 30,000 people to the event.



Flying usually commences at midday and continues to around 4pm.
